I. **CALL MEETING TO ORDER** – Chairperson/Vice-chairperson. Chairman Abrego convened the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees at 7:30 p.m., and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

B. GOOD NEWS -

A. Kristopher Walleart – Request Board Approval to Start a Program at HMS. Mr. Walleart requested the board's permission to start an Adopt-a-Cop program for the 5th grade at HMS. He explained that an officer from law enforcement, both MHPD and Elmore County Sheriff's Office, would go to class for one-hour a week to engage with students in a positive atmosphere. The board asked for some clarification on the number of hours per week and the number of officers participating. <u>Trustee Monasterio motioned to approve starting the program for 5th grade at HMS. Trustee Binion seconded the motion. Motion granted.</u>

- **B.** MOUNTAIN HOME AFB UPDATE MHAFB Liaison. Mr. Niksich stated that there wasn't anything new, but there are lots of toys available for carnivals to contact him.
- **C. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT** James Gilbert. Superintendent Gilbert reported that semester finals would start Wednesday for MHHS. He also reported on the sewage line break at MHHS over the weekend and with the lines being repaired before Monday, so there was no need to cancel school.

Superintendent Gilbert informed the board that these two policies were revised to ensure MHHS and BMHS's graduation requirements met state and district requirements. <u>Trustee Donahue motioned to approve the 1st reading of the proposed revision of the Graduation Requirements Policy MHHS and the Graduation Requirements Policy BMHS, as presented by Superintendent Gilbert. Trustee Knox seconded the motion. Motion approved.</u>
