SCHOOL BOARD MEETING JANUARY 16, 2018 SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION OFFICE

I. **CALL MEETING TO ORDER** – Chairperson/Vice-chairperson. Chairman Abrego convened the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees at 7:30 p.m., and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

B. ELECTION OF SCHOOL DISTRICT OFFICERS -

- 1. Election of Deputy Clerk, School District 193, for the remainder of the 2017-18 school year. Chairman Abrego opened nominations for Deputy Clerk. Trustee Monasterio nominated Levi Vick as Deputy Clerk, with a second from Trustee Binion. With there being no other nominations, Chairman Abrego declared Levi Vick as Deputy Clerk for the remainder of the 2017-18 school year.
- 2. **Election of Treasurer, School District 193, for the remainder of the 2017-18 school year.** Chairman Abrego opened nominations for Treasurer. <u>Trustee Binion nominated Levi Vick as Treasurer</u>, with a second from Trustee Monasterio. With there being no other nominations, <u>Chairman Abrego declared Levi Vick elected Treasurer for the remainder of the 2017-18 school year.</u>

If you have a complaint against personnel or students by name, you need to schedule an appointment with the Superintendent. There will be no action taken at this time, but action on a problem area could be scheduled for a subsequent meeting of the board.

VI. **REPORTS** –

A. MOUNTAIN HOME AFB UPDATE – MHAFB Liaison. Allen Niksich. Mr. Niksich notified the board that the base would be having military exercises, so parents will be tired, and student might be frustrated.

Mr. Niksich then informed the board that the SAC were setting up appointments to present the quarterly SAC Educator of the Quarter awards to Mr. Ben Rayfield, MHHS, and Mrs. Tammy Barney, West Elementary. He also informed the board that they were currently recruited a lot of volunteers for the upcoming STEAM night and Science Fairs in the different schools, as well as recruiting judges for the upcoming Speech and Debate tournaments.

Mr. Niksich reported that they (MHAFB) were able to verify all but four families who didn't return their Federal Survey cards, but were federally impacted. He added that he explained to base personnel that the school district could receive up to \$1 million dollars on a good year.

Mr. Niksich asked the schools to please remind their students that they need to be very careful crossing streets even if using a crosswalk.


Mr. Niksich thanked all district staff, coaches, parents, volunteers, and even those without children who do so much for our next generation. The board thanked him.

B. BUILDING PRESENTATIONS – HMS – Lonnie Smith




















- Chairman Abrego asked about the Gifted & Talented program and if there were more students
 who could qualify and if so, was there a limit to the amount of students in GT. Mrs. Smith
 responded that there is no limit and that she had already sent Mr. Holland a list of students who
 needed to be tested.
- Trustee Binion asked about the 18 student suspensions this year and if they were repeat offenders. Mrs. Smith explained that a small population of the students has behavior issues. Trustee Binion stated that everyone needed to understand that four different elementary schools send all of their 4th graders to HMS as 5th graders, so students going from a building student population of maybe 200, to a building with a population of over 500 would present challenges for HMS and he thanked the teachers for their efforts. Mrs. Smith agreed and believed that they are doing a good job.
- Trustee Monasterio agreed with Trustee Binion with regards students from four (4) smaller elementary schools coming together into one building. He then asked for clarification of the AVID program and how it impacts students. Mrs. Smith explained AVID, the strategies, the organization, etc., and how it impacted students
- **C. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT** James Gilbert. Mr. Gilbert informed the board about the recent John Gordon presentation that was open to everyone and how great it was to start the second semester on such a positive note.

Mr. Gilbert stated that there would be a bid opening on February 2 for the massive electronic project to upgrade and install wiring and such to make the buildings technology capable. He added that it would be interesting to see how it goes given the age of the different buildings throughout the district.

Mr. Gilbert reported that the district was having a PBIS conference at the end of this week in which several staff will attend. He added that there would be a community letter going out tomorrow to inform the community and parents on how things are going and to let them know that the district plans to run another \$2.7 million supplemental levy on March 13.

Mr. Gilbert stated how happy he was with the work that Levi Vick has done and he brings in new ideas to the district. He said that we have gotten to see the strengths that Levi brings to the district and to his position. Mr. Gilbert added that Levi brings a different skill-set and he brings different ways of looking at our business operations and budgeting cycle, we can expect some changes in how we do business.

Trustee Binion asked if the wiring project would bring in more electrical power to the buildings; Mr. Gilbert responded that it depended on the building and the age of the building. Trustee Binion then asked if we received any help or assistance from Idaho Power and the response was no, we didn't receive any help.

Trustee Monasterio clarified that projects like this is to bring our building into the 21st century concerning

technology and electronics. Mr. Gilbert agreed and informed everyone that now with our DoDEA grant, our district is one-to-one with students, K-8, and Chromebooks. He then said with this grant, the district would be able to finish the Chromebook implementation K-12; that is a really big milestone for Mountain Home.

Mr. Gilbert thanked Will Goodman for all of his hard work and time regarding the DoDEA grant. He said that he appreciated Mr. Goodman's hard work.

VII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS -

 - National School Lunch Hearing Officer Mr. Gilbert requested approval to appoint Levi Vick as the National School Lunch Hearing Officer for the remainder of the 2017-2018 school year. <u>A</u> motion received by Trustee Binion to appoint Levi Vick as the National School Lunch Hearing Officer for the remainder of the 2017-2018 school year, received a second from Trustee Donahue. Motion granted.

- **A. OUT-OF-DISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATIONS** James Gilbert. Mr. Gilbert requested approval of the open enrollment application for the 2018-2019 school year. The parents will provide transportation to and from school.

<u>Trustee Donahue motioned to approve the Out-of-District Open Enrollment Application as presented by Mr. Gilbert, with a second from Trustee Knox. Motion passed.</u>

B. APPROVAL OF DISTRICT CALENDARS – MHSD & BMHS – 2018-2019 (*ACTION*) – James Gilbert. Mr. Gilbert presented the 2018-19 MHSD and BMHS attendance calendars for approval. He said the calendars are similar to what the district had in place this school year and the year before. He also added that there has been lots of positive feedback from parent and staff. <u>Trustee Monasterio motioned to approve the 2018-19 MHSD and BMHS Calendars</u>. <u>Trustee Binion seconded the motion</u>. <u>Motion approved</u>.

IX. **EXECUTIVE SESSION** – Student Matters
